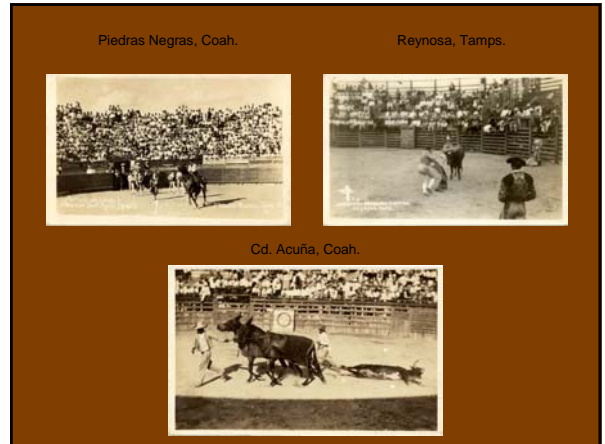


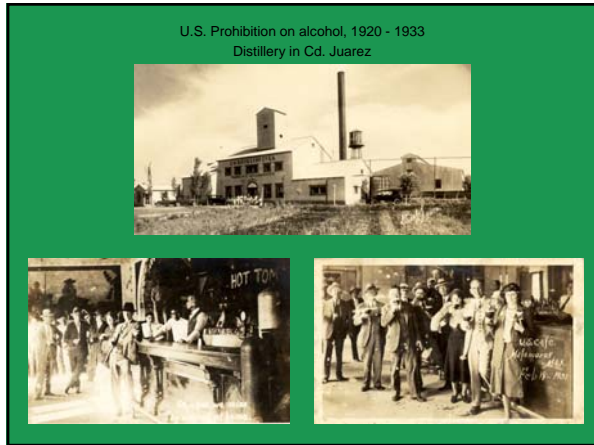

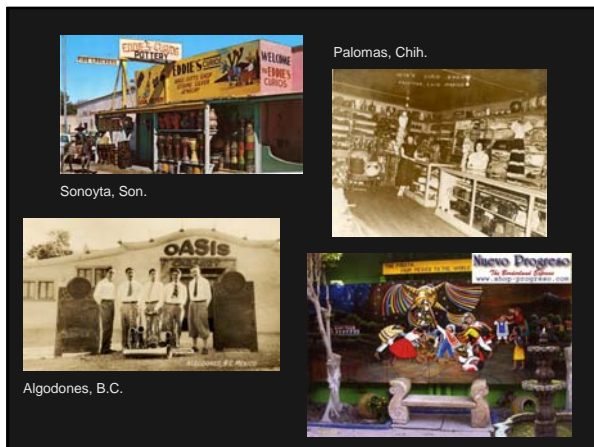

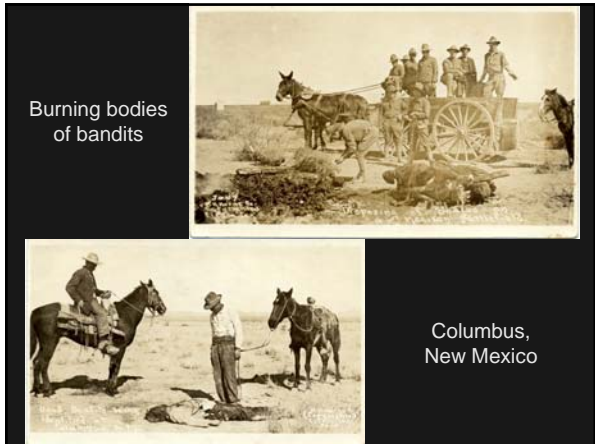

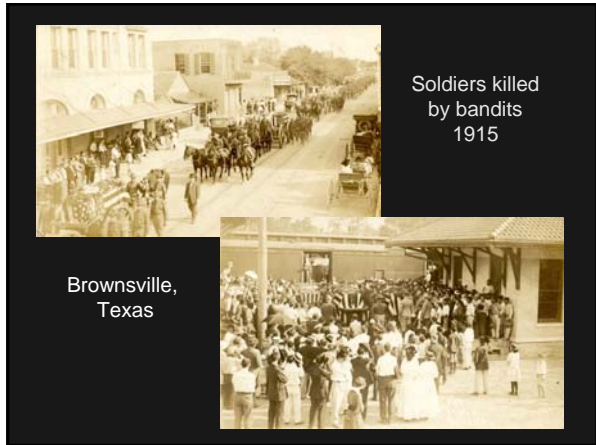

GARRANZA PROMISES PEACE ON BORDER

Gives Pledge to American Army Officers on International Bridge at Brownsville.

AGREES TO PUNISH BANDITS

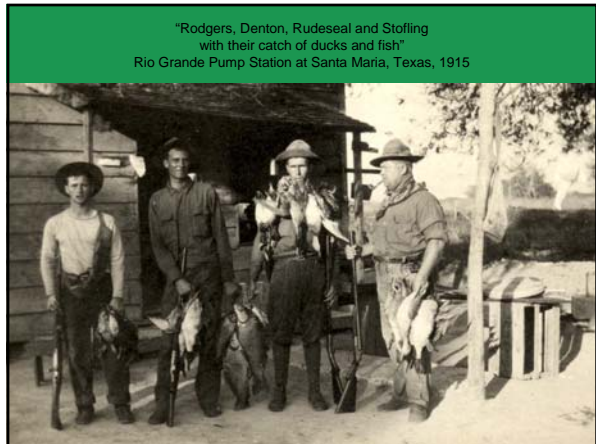
Delegation of Texas Merchants Praises First Chief's Work— Ready to Resume Traffic.

BROWNVILLE, Texas, Nov. 29.—General Carranza at the Sisco-United States boundary agreement on the international bridge here at noon today reaffirmed (renewed) promises with Colonel A. F. Williams of the Third Cavalry, commander of the United States patrol of this frontier.

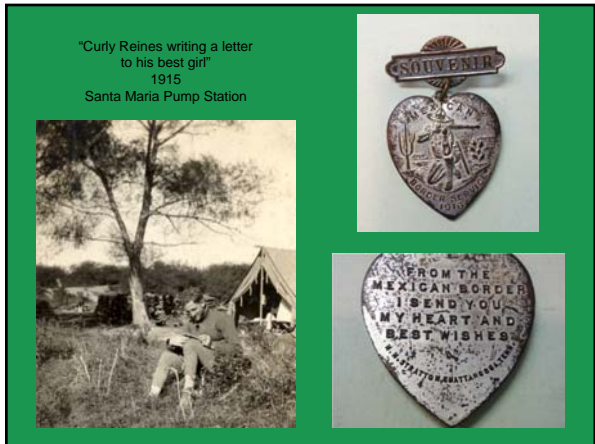
General Carranza himself entered on the scene, border troubles and assured Colonel Williams there would be no further acts of violence that might be attributed to anyone on the Mexican side. He said if any lawlessness occurred it would be because Mexican officials had no knowledge of it, and that any such acts would be checked as quickly as possible. Both commanders expressed regret that owing to army regulations, American army officers could not visit. Williams said that part of the festivities attendant upon General Carranza's visit.
